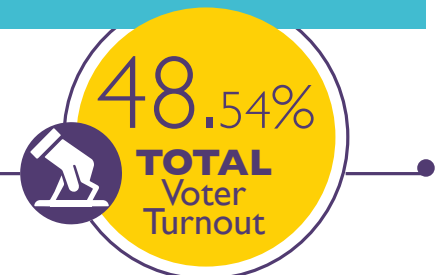

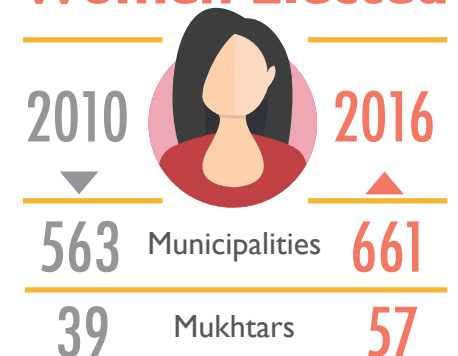

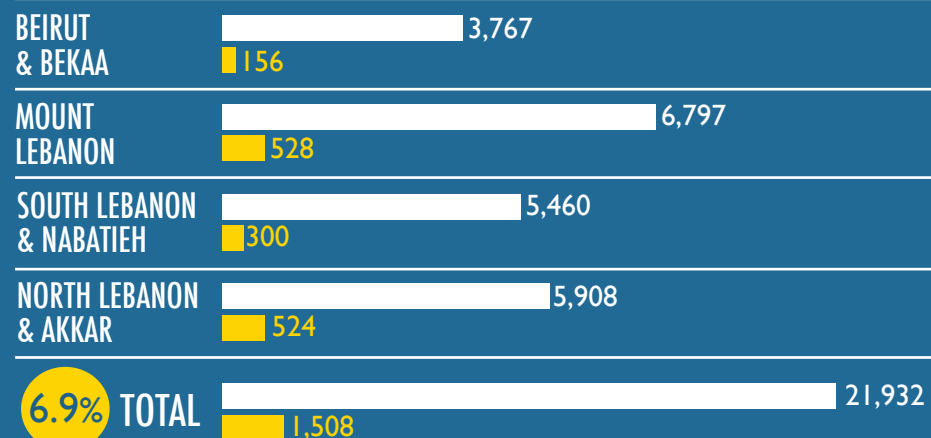

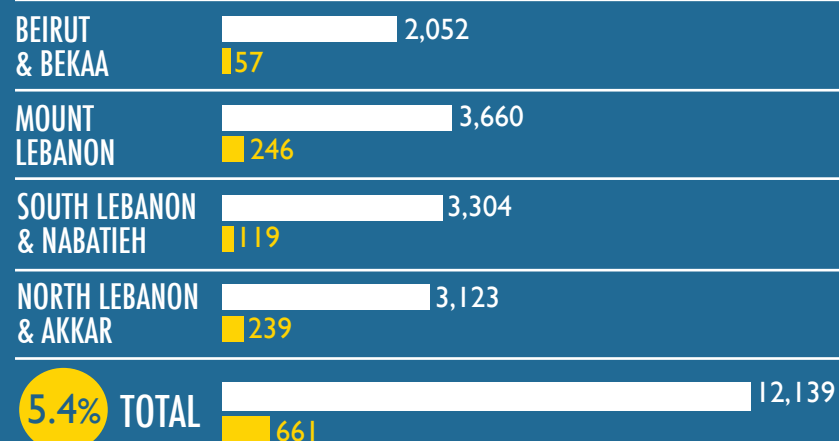

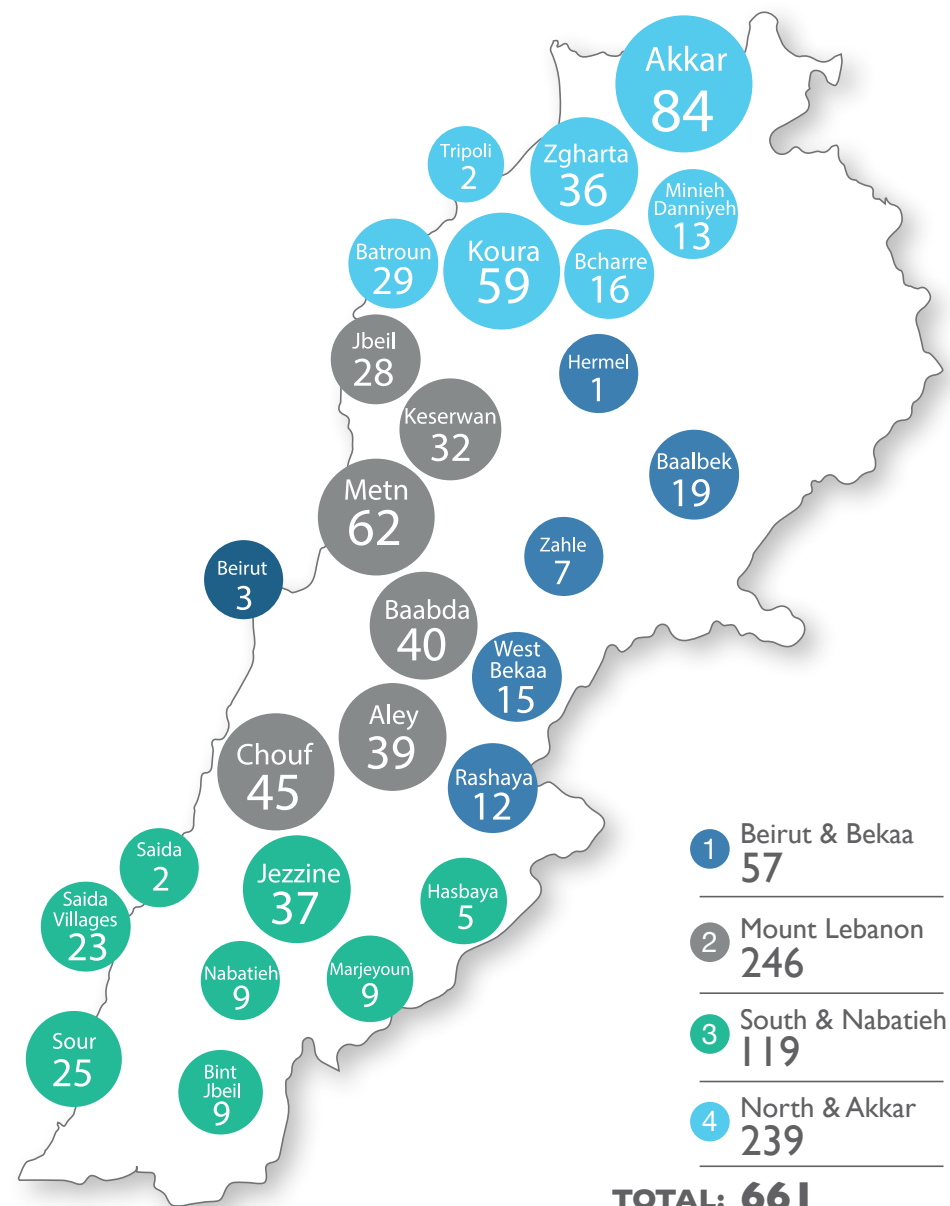

Municipal Elections 2016 Women Elected by District



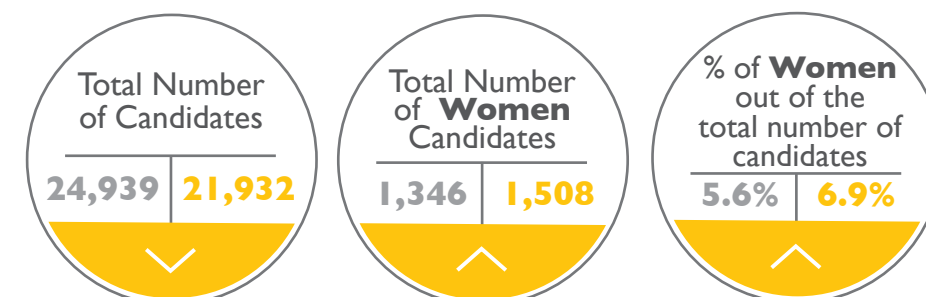
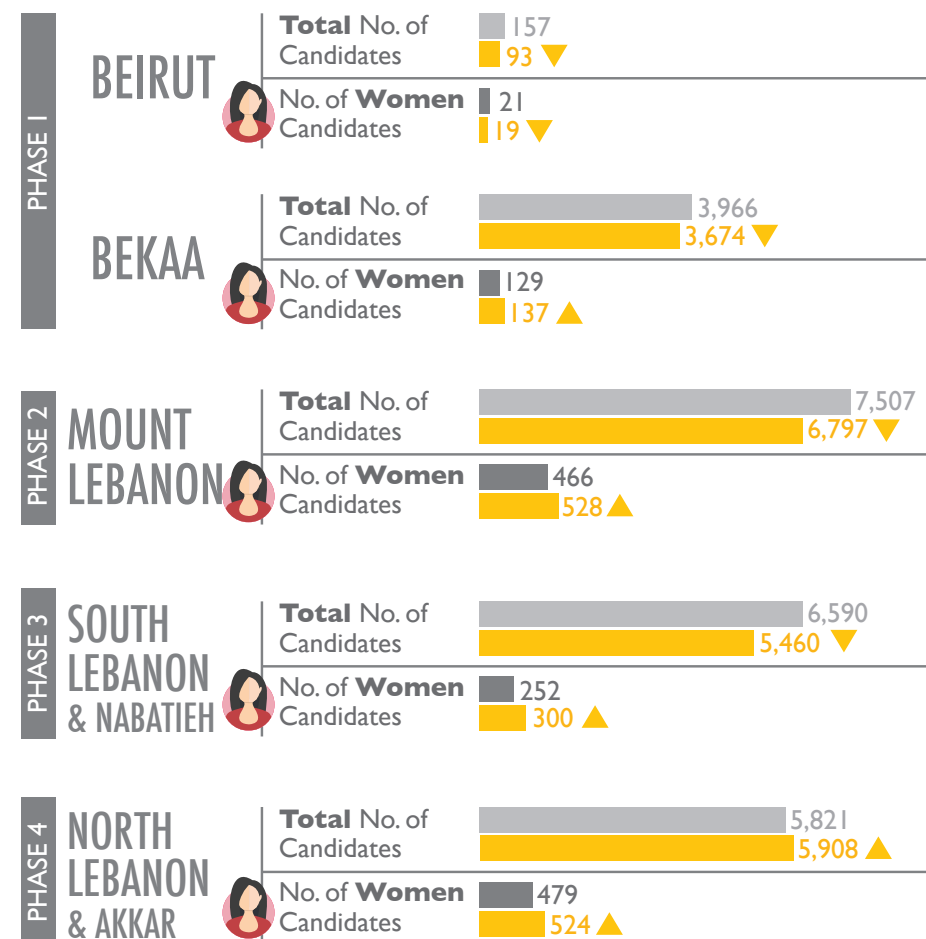

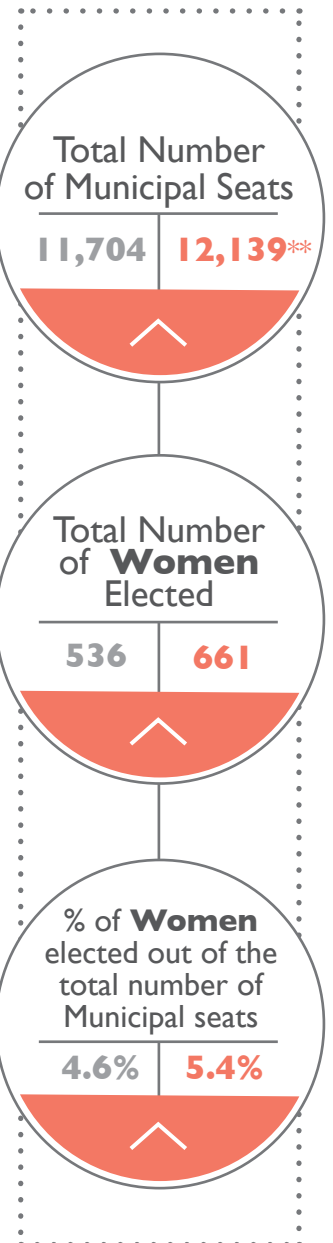
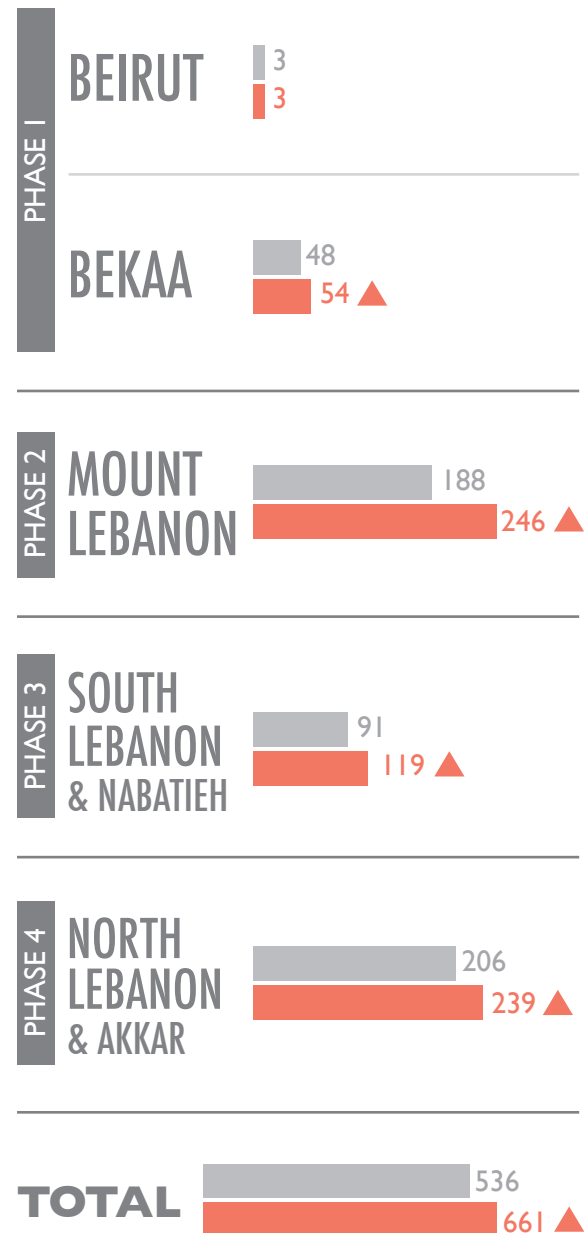

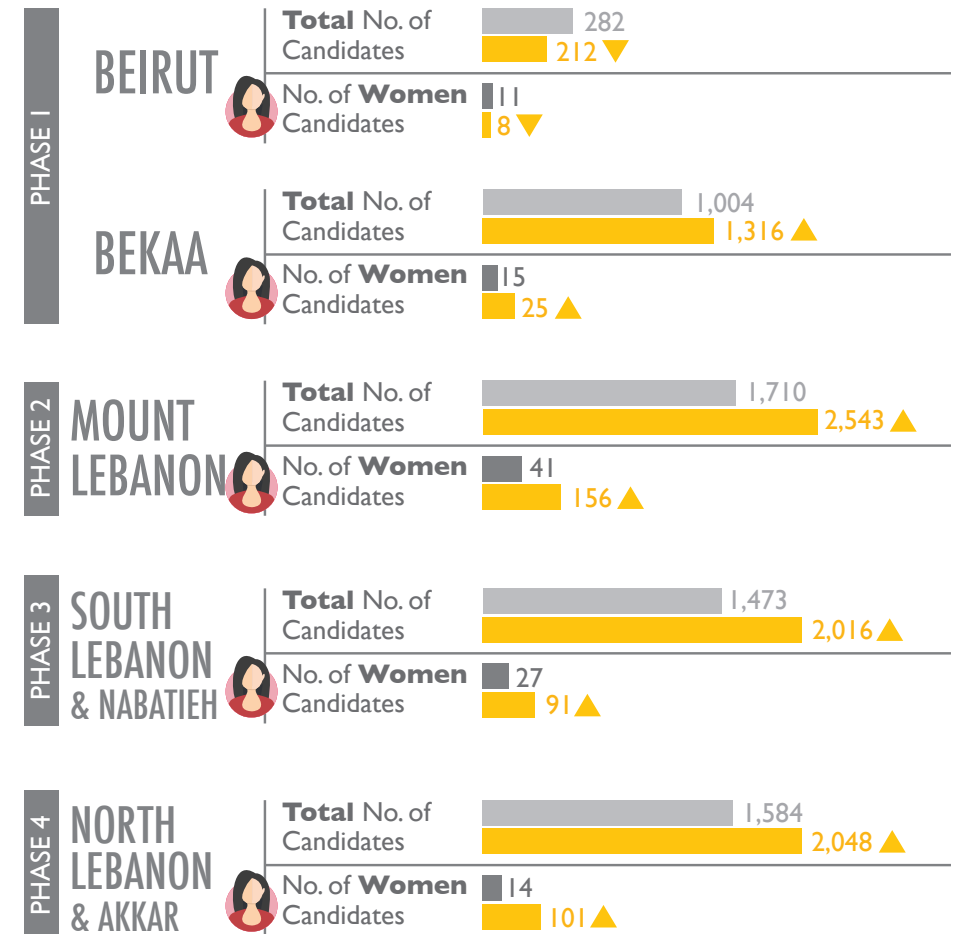

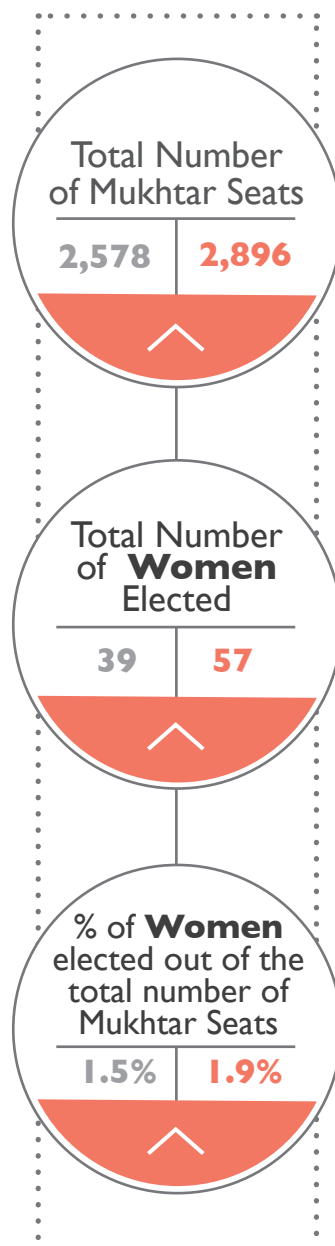
